## LAND USE

The solar farm will not be removing land from agricultural use. The land can continue to be used for food production for the lifetime of the solar park, normally with sheep grazing in the wide spaces between and under the panels in autumn and winter and with wild flower meadows in summer creating a biodiversity haven. Planning consent and the landowners' lease both require the land to be returned to its former agricultural use at the end of the 25-year life of the park.

There is plenty of land available for solar development with a negligible impact on food production:

- In England just 2.3% of land is built on (source: UK National Ecosystem Assessment report, 2011)
- Solar farms currently use 0.02% of all UK land.
- 10 times more land is being permanently taken out of • agricultural production by EU environmental schemes.
- 100 times more land is taken up by golf courses than solar farms.
- Ground-mounted solar PV yields 6 to 10 times more electricity per acre than the equivalent biofuel crop (such as miscanthus).
