Comments: i write to confirm my objections to the proposed developement at Moneyatone

quarry on several aspects,

the extra 250 deellings wil increase the size of the population of the area be over 100%, with no consideration to the associated infrastructure.

the developement in narrow terms has limited impact but upon the wider community will be telling. There are no footpaths available in the area nad the increase in cars will be unacceptable to pedestrians, the developement is in an area of high sensitivity with low or limited capcity as stated by the local authority in 2001; so the plans are not meeting the core strategy plan SS7 (2014) in being of a scale and nature to conserve and enhances the landscape.

the Local authority has let a local community be taken away with out due cosideration of the community, in a poorly managed planning process.
