I have lived at the bottom of Grosvenor Street where you approach the Recreation Ground from for 48 years.

It wants turning down forthwith for many reasons a few being:-

Whenever I go to Asda, trying to exit Springfield Road onto Ashbourne Road is just dreadful, if 90% houses were to be built, there would be 2 cars to every house, and possibly 3, I know the cul de sac where we live, the majority of house owners have 2 cars and the thought of milltown way being used as an entrance and exit road is mind boggling.

What about all the wildlife which there is a lot of :- bats are a protected specie which my husband sees when he takes our dog out when it is dusk, badgers also are a protected specie which we have both personally seen and nests, foxes, birds of every description. The

land that surrounds the beautiful Pickwood Hall (Grade 2 listed) would be ruined, Mr. Challiner who had Pickwood Hall built and also gave the Rec (now Village Green Status) would be rains turning in his grave at the very thought of it. Having lived here for so long we have quite a deep knowledge of the Rec and the Hall and surrounding fields which are steeped with history, we have taken all our dogs round the rec over many years and the thought of it being encased in houses makes my husband and myself shudder with horror.

Sadly if permission were to be given to the land in question would be gone forever, never to return.

I sincerely hope you will turn Gladman down and let them turn their attention to brownfield sites.
