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1.0 Introduction

Context

- 1.1 The Stilwell Partnership has been appointed by C B Collier FB Limited (the Applicant), to prepare a Travel Plan Framework (TPF) to accompany a planning application to seek permission for the proposed development of 56 dwellings on the former Fole Dairy Site at Uttoxeter Road, Fole. The Proposed Site Layout is shown in **Appendix A**.

Purpose of Travel Plan Framework (TPF)

- 1.2 This Travel Plan Framework (TPF) has been designed for the developer, to provide for the development with a means to effectively manage the transport needs of the residents and visitors to the development. The TPF is not intended to be anti-car but will detail the alternative modes of transport available as much as possible, as well as promoting new measures and improvements to existing infrastructure as part of developer contributions. The TPF is designed to encourage residents and visitors to use cars more efficiently where necessary, whilst providing incentives to use alternative sustainable modes of transport.

Consented Scheme (2014)

- 1.3 The site received planning permission in 2014 for the partial demolition of the existing dairy buildings and redevelopment of a housing led mixed-use scheme (Ref No. SMD/2013/0028) which comprised 60 dwelling and 300sqm of B1 office space. The permitted development site plan is included at **Appendix B**.

Existing Site

- 1.4 The development site accommodates the former Fole Dairy and has an area of approximately 2 hectares. It was established as part of the permitted application, that at its peak, the dairy employed in the region of 235 staff, 210 of these working a typical day shift and 25 working the night shift. In addition, approximately 30 heavy goods vehicles (HGVs) were continually making deliveries to and from the site each day. Most of buildings on the site have been demolished and the site has been cleared
- 1.5 The developer will be committed financially to undertake the “Measures” as detailed in **Section 9.0** of this report.

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2.0 Planning Policy Context

Introduction

2.1 This chapter sets out the current and relevant policies at national, regional and local level which underpin the development of the site from transport and highways perspective. They include:

- Transport White Paper – Creating growth, cutting carbon (January 2011)
- National Planning Policy Framework (March 2012)
- Staffordshire Local Transport Plan (2011 - 2026)
- Staffordshire Moorlands Local Plan (2017).

Transport White Paper - Creating Growth, Cutting Carbon (January 2011)

2.2 'Creating Growth, Cutting Carbon' sets out the Government's objectives for a greener and safer transport network that encourages economic growth and improves quality of life for communities.

2.3 The White Paper encourages the implementation of sustainable local transport systems and aims to remove the previous top-down approach to transport planning. Local Authorities will have the power to implement and tailor transport systems and schemes based on local needs and behaviour.

2.4 The economic aims of the White Paper can be achieved by increasing access to employment and services, reducing carbon emissions, increasing public transport accessibility, and as a by-product, increasing the number of people using safer transport methods with wider health benefits.

2.5 The White Paper notes the key role of travel planning in achieving the Government's objectives, as set out below:

"The Government wants to encourage and enable more sustainable transport choices. [...] In transport terms, this might be exemplified by reducing unnecessary signs, posts and other street clutter to improve road safety and encourage walking, by travel planning, or by presenting information in such a way as to encourage choice"

National Planning Policy Framework (March 2012)

2.6 'On the 27th March 2012 the National Planning Policy Framework was published, which sets out the Government's planning policies for England. The new document is a key part of the Government's reforms to make the planning system less complex and more accessible, to protect the environment and to promote sustainable growth.

2.7 With regards to sustainable travel NPPF states:

Para 29

2.8 Transport policies have an important role to play in facilitating sustainable development but also in contributing to wider sustainability and health objectives. Smarter use of technologies can reduce the need to travel. The transport system needs to be balanced in favour of sustainable transport modes, giving people a real choice about how they travel. However, the Government recognises that different policies and measures will be required in different communities and opportunities to maximise sustainable transport solutions will vary from urban to rural areas.

Para 30

2.9 Encouragement should be given to solutions which support reductions in greenhouse gas emissions and reduce congestion. In preparing Local Plans, local planning authorities should therefore support a pattern of development which, where reasonable to do so, facilitates the use of sustainable modes of transport.

Para 32

2.10 All developments that generate significant amounts of movement should be supported by a Transport Statement or Transport Assessment. Plans and decisions should take account of whether:

- The opportunities for sustainable transport modes have been taken up depending on the nature and location of the site, to reduce the need for major transport infrastructure;
- Safe and suitable access to the site can be achieved for all people; and
- Improvements can be undertaken within the transport network that will cost-effectively limit the significant impacts of the development. Development should only be prevented or refused on transport grounds where the residual cumulative impacts of development are severe.

Staffordshire Local Transport Plan 2011 - 2026

- 2.11 The Local Transport Plan (LTP) sets the long-term transport strategy for Staffordshire. It aims to influence how and when people choose to travel so that individual travel decisions do not cumulatively impact on the desirability of Staffordshire as a place to live, work and invest.

Staffordshire Moorlands Local Plan 2017

- 2.12 Reducing the need to travel and reducing the reliance on the car is a well-established planning principle stemming from concerns at combating climate change (reducing vehicular emissions) and of addressing social equity (ensuring physical accessibility to all sections of society). The Staffordshire Local Transport Plan is the principal means of addressing transport issues in the District, and the proposed policy approach seeks to ensure that proposals in the Local Plan are helping deliver the objectives of this Local Transport Plan.
- 2.13 It is considered that there is potential in influencing modal shift away from the car in Staffordshire Moorlands in two respects - by targeting public transport improvements along the main 'work corridors' connecting the Moorlands with the conurbation; and by promoting public transport schemes within rural areas and between rural areas and towns. The Council's Development Capacity Studies have examined the accessibility of the main settlements in the District using the existing transport network including public transport and this has informed the development approach and identification of development areas. However, it is important that strategic planning decisions are not purely based on the location of existing public transport infrastructure. For this reason, the proposed policies are proactive in seeking improvements to the existing network.
- 2.14 Policy T1 reflects national transport planning policy in the NPPF which seeks to deliver a system that supports sustainable transport through the integration with land use planning at all levels, so that transport and planning work together to support more sustainable travel choices and reduce the need to travel. However, the NPPF also drives for the expeditious delivery of necessary development and is therefore clear that proposals should only be refused on transport grounds alone, where residual cumulative impacts of development are 'severe'. Reducing the need to travel, and reliance on the car, is linked to social equality, through making developments equally 'accessible' to all sections of society. The Policy aims to benefit not only work-related travel but also that for shopping, leisure and recreation etc.
- 2.15 The approach embodied in this policy will seek to manage travel demand in an effective and sustainable way, while improving the range of choice and responding to the needs of residents, workers and visitors.

- 2.16 The Council will continue to work closely with the Highway Authority to ensure the coordination of proposals within the Local Plan and the Local Transport Plan: the 'Staffordshire Moorlands District Integrated Transport Strategy 2013-2031' explains how the LTP is expected to be delivered in the Staffordshire Moorlands and where the County Council's transport investment, and other funding resources, are expected to be targeted. The location of development and the way that development is carried out are important factors in helping achieve the priorities of the Local Transport Plan; and in the case of proposals affecting the Strategic Road Network closely involve Highways England (formerly the Highways Agency) such that it can undertake its duties as set out in DfT Circular 2/13 Strategic Road Network and Delivery of Sustainable Development. Choices about where new housing and employment uses are located for example, and patterns of travel that result, will be important factors in helping to reduce reliance on the private car. Encouraging alternative forms of travel and securing access to the most sustainable modes of travel such as public transport, walking or cycling, represent approaches which aim to help achieve a new balance between non-motorised transport, public transport and private car use.
- 2.17 This approach also reflects the aims of the Council's Sustainable Community Strategy and the Corporate Plan priorities to promote improved health and protect the environment. The Council will aim to ensure as far as possible, development minimises traffic problems and maximises the potential benefits of accessibility and new infrastructure to the wider community.
- 2.18 The Government issued a ministerial statement in 2015 which stated arbitrary parking standards that restrict off-street parking (such as maximum standards), should not be applied when assessing planning proposals, without compelling justification. Therefore, the Council will consider the appropriateness of proposed off-street parking in schemes, on a case by case basis, after (where appropriate) having consulted with SCC Highways Officer (and Manual for Streets (2007)/Manual for Streets 2(2010)), rather than referring to formally laid out standards. However, the Council has, after consultation with SCC Highways Officer, published recent guidance to accompany this Local Plan which suggests 'minimum' provision of spaces, depending on use class; these are set out in Appendix 8 of the Local Plan.
- 2.19 The Council has a statutory responsibility to consult various organisations before determining planning applications (depending on the scale and impact of the proposals) as laid out in the Development Management Procedure Order. For example, the Council must consult the Secretary of State for Transport, Staffordshire Highways Authority, or Network Rail for proposals which would increase traffic volumes upon trunk roads, classified roads, or railway level crossings (respectively). It is also important that major new developments help to mitigate any adverse impacts they may otherwise have on transport and travel. Transport Assessments are required to be prepared where any application would have significant transport implications (in line with DfT's former Guidance on Transport Assessment (March 2007), in consultation with the Highways Authority, so as to determine necessary mitigation measures. Where appropriate, S106 planning obligations, or any adopted Community Infrastructure Levy, will be used to ensure that such developments provide for related transport improvements and fund other appropriate mitigation measures. This may also require developers to fund any qualitative improvements required in relation to existing facilities and infrastructure as a direct result of increased patronage resulting from new development. Further details regarding potential access and sustainable transport requirements for individual site allocations are set out in this Plan.

Adopted Core Strategy 2014

- 2.20 Reducing the need to travel and reducing the reliance on the car is a well established planning principle stemming from concerns at combating climate change (reducing vehicular emissions) and of addressing social equity (ensuring physical accessibility to all sections of society). The Staffordshire Local Transport Plan (refer to para. 1.29 for further explanation) is the principal means of addressing transport issues in the District, and the proposed policy approach seeks to ensure that proposals in the LDF are helping deliver the objectives of this Local Transport Plan.
- 2.21 It is considered that there is potential in affecting modal shift away from the car in Staffordshire Moorlands in two respects - by targeting public transport improvements along the main 'work corridors' connecting the Moorlands with the conurbation; and by promoting public transport schemes within rural areas and between rural areas and towns. The Development Capacity Study has examined the accessibility of the main settlements in the District using the existing transport network including public transport and this has informed the development approach and identification of development areas. However, it is important that strategic planning decisions are not purely based on the location of existing public transport infrastructure. For this reason, the proposed policies are proactive in seeking improvements to the existing network. Policy T1 identifies specific development measures which reduce reliance on the car and reduce the need to travel, whilst policy T2 identifies broader measures which promote better accessibility, create safer roads, reduce the impact of traffic, or facilitate highway improvements.

Development and Sustainable Transport

- 2.21 The Council will promote and support development which reduces reliance on the private car for travel journeys, reduces the need to travel generally and helps deliver the priorities of the Staffordshire Local Transport Plans, where this is consistent with other policies. This will be achieved by:
1. Ensuring that all new development is located where the highway network can satisfactorily accommodate traffic generated by the development or can be improved as part of the development.
 2. Ensuring that major development is located in areas that are accessible by sustainable travel modes or can be made accessible as part of the proposal.
 3. Referring to appropriate parking standards as laid out in national guidance, or any parking standards that may be produced locally.
 4. Development which generates significant demand for travel or is likely to have significant transport implications (as identified within a Transport Assessment) will, where appropriate:
 - Contribute to improved public transport provision
 - Provide proactive facilities and measures to support sustainable transport modes including on-site features to encourage sustainable travel methods e.g. cycle path links, cycle storage facilities, bus stops etc
 - Provide and actively promote travel plans.


- 2.22 In line with priorities set out in the NPPF and the Staffordshire Local Transport Plan, and through working with partner organisations, the Council will encourage and support measures which promote better accessibility, create safer roads, reduce the impact of traffic, or facilitate highway improvements. In particular, the Council will:
1. Support, subject to feasibility assessment, new road schemes within the District (where not already identified as priorities in the Local Transport Plan) where:
 - a. there would be evidence to suggest positive impact and need for the scheme; and
 - b. it would be in accord with the general objectives and policies of the
 2. Support, subject to feasibility assessment, strategic infrastructure improvements and links to major urban areas for example to road, rail, bus facilities in the District and the development of new rail or bus termini within the District
 3. Continue to safeguard all existing disused railway lines within the District and support the reuse of these for public or commercial/tourism use. To this end the Council will refuse any development which would impede or truncate these routes. However, proposals for recreational routes, cycleways, bridleways etc will generally be acceptable.
 4. Work with its partners to promote the improvement/expansion of existing bus services and the provision of innovative sustainable transport services in the District, particularly those serving rural areas;
 5. Support and promote the development of a network of safe walking, horse riding and cycling routes (including the National Cycle Network), connecting to transport interchanges, linking communities and recreational/tourist areas.
 6. Seek to minimise the environmental impact of freight road transport and to work with Staffordshire County Council and other partner organisations to agree designated lorry routes, freight handling facilities and greater rail use.

3.0 Existing Conditions

Existing Site

- 3.1 The site is located within the village of Fole, Uttoxeter and occupies a parcel of land located to the south of the A522 Uttoxeter Road, as shown on **Figure 3.1** below:

Figure 3.1: Site Location Map



- 3.2 The site is in a semi-rural location surrounded by agricultural fields to the west and south, with residential properties on the northern side of Uttoxeter Road.
- 3.3 Historically, there were several car parks on the site to accommodate the 235 staff. Most the spaces were provided to the north east of the site accessed via the lane running to the east of the site. Additionally, there were significant areas of hard standing within the site which were also used for parking and service vehicles. The main access for HGVs and delivery vehicles was the access directly into Uttoxeter Road, to the north west of the site.

Local Highway Network

- 3.4 Near the application site, the following adopted local roads are considered relevant for considering the impact, if any, the development proposal may have on the operation of the local highway network:
- Uttoxeter Road (A522)
 - The unnamed Lane to the east of the site.

Uttoxeter Road (A522)

- 3.5 Uttoxeter Road (A522) provides a connection between the towns Cheadle (in the Northwest) and Uttoxeter (in the South East). Near the site, the A522 Uttoxeter Road has a carriageway width of approximately 6m and is subject to a 30mph speed limit. Street lighting and footways are provided along the site's frontage on both sides of the A522 Uttoxeter Road, however the footway on the southern side is narrow and in a poor condition.
- 3.6 The footway on the northern side of the A522 Uttoxeter Road provides a continuous link to the bus stop to the east of the site and to the village of Checkley approximately 1.4km to the west of the site.

Unnamed Lane

- 3.7 The Lane runs to the east of the site and is rural in nature. It serves access to just a few properties and is very lightly trafficked. Several redundant dairy buildings abut the carriageway and the Lane is shared use in character. Vehicle speeds along the lane are low.

4.0 Proposed Development

4.1 The development proposal is for a residential development comprising of 56 dwellings being very similar to that of the permitted development. The breakdown in the units is for:

- 8 x 2-bed houses
- 25 x 3-bed houses
- 23 x 4-bed houses.

4.2 The Proposed Site Layout is shown in **Appendix A**.

Proposed Access and Sightlines

4.3 The principal site access will be positioned in the same location to that of the permitted scheme (and in a very similar position to the existing access which served the dairy). The access will be 5.5m wide and 4.5m kerb radii will be provided onto Uttoxeter Road to reduce vehicle speeds and to reduce pedestrian crossing distances.

4.4 Sightlines of 2.4m x 90m will be provided in both directions, as per the permitted scheme. The development, with the provision of wider footways and houses facing onto the street, will help change the character of the road and evidence suggests that vehicle speeds would reduce as drivers adapt to their surroundings.

4.5 A secondary access will be provided from the Lane to the east of the site. The new houses will be positioned with frontages facing onto the lane, in line with Manual for Street principles. The dwellings will have direct vehicular access from the Lane as per the permitted development. This is considered acceptable as the vehicle speeds and volumes on the Lane are very low. It is also like the historic parking arrangements for the dairy.

4.6 The Lane will be treated as a shared surface with colour contrasting materials and textures, helping to keep traffic speeds low. The full scheme will be subject to further discussions with the highway authority at detailed design stage.

Pedestrians

4.7 Pedestrians and cyclists will be able to access the site either from the main two access points or from a new pedestrian / cycle only access which will be provided onto Uttoxeter Road. The footway on the southern side of Uttoxeter Road will be widened to 2m along the length of the site frontage to increase pedestrian provision.

Proposed Car Parking

4.8 Staffordshire Moorlands Parking Standards are generally, 1 space per 2-bedroom unit; 2 spaces per 3-bedroom unit and 3 spaces per 4-bedroom unit. Parking will be provided in line with these standards with additional visitor parking located throughout the site.

Proposed Cycle Parking

- 4.9 Safe and secure cycle parking spaces will be provided for every dwelling. These will be provided either within garden sheds; garages or secure cycle stores.

Proposed Servicing and Delivery

- 4.10 Servicing will be carried out on-site. Internally, turning areas are provided allowing all anticipated service vehicles, including fire tenders and refuse vehicles to enter and exit the development in a forward gear. Serving areas / bays have also been provided on the Lane.

5.0 Site Accessibility & Sustainability

Pedestrians

- 5.1 Pedestrian and cycle access will be provided from the main vehicular accesses to the site. It is also proposed that a new pedestrian access will be provided from the A522 Uttoxeter Road which will improve access to the site and provide residents with a direct route to the bus stops.
- 5.2 The proposed development will widen the footway on the southern side of the A522 Uttoxeter Road to 2m wide. This will improve pedestrian linkages to the bus stop on the southern side of the A522 Uttoxeter Road and also provide a larger waiting area for pedestrians at the bus stop.
- 5.3 A footway is provided on the northern side of the A522 Uttoxeter Road which provides a continuous link to the bus stop to the east of the site and the village of Checkley to the west of the site.
- 5.4 The site is near the services and facilities provided within the settlement of Checkley approximately 1,400m (18-minute walk) to the west. Facilities include;
- A primary school (Hutchinson Memorial);
 - A Community Centre (with pre-school nursery and bowls club);
 - A church;
 - A cricket club;
 - 2 pub / restaurants.

Cyclists

- 5.5 5km is considered an acceptable distance to which cycling can be used as an alternative to travel by private car or for linked trips to public transport facilities. Based on a relatively slow cycling speed of 15kph, this distance can be cycled in around 20 minutes. Areas including Spath, Upper Tean, Lower Tean, Hollington, Church Leigh, and parts of Uttoxeter, can be cycled to within 20 minutes.
- 5.6 The Lane to the east of the site and is classified as an “on road advisory cycle” route. This route links into a wider network of on and off-road cycle routes around Staffordshire and provides access to Uttoxeter in the East and Cheadle in the west. The Cycle Route Plan is included at **Appendix C**.

Buses

- 5.7 The nearest bus stop to the site for eastbound travel is located on the northern side of the A522 Uttoxeter Road approximately 350m from the centre of the site, within IHTs recommended distance of 400m. This bus stop benefits from a layby and bus shelter.

- 5.8 The nearest bus stop to the site for westbound travel is located on the southern side of the A522 Uttoxeter Road, along the sites frontage. As per the permitted scheme, this bus stop will be upgraded to provide raised kerbs to assist access for the mobility impaired. A summary of the bus service is shown in **Table 6.1** below and full timetable is found at **Appendix D**.

Trains

- 5.9 Although no railway stations are within acceptable walking or cycling distance of the site, the bus service which stops outside the site provides an acceptable link (22-minute journey including walk and bus time) to Uttoxeter Railway station. Non-stop services from this station call at Derby and Crewe. A brief train service summary is shown below in **Table 6.2**.

- 5.10 The site although semi-rural in nature has good links to buses providing access to the larger towns in the area for shopping, leisure and work opportunities. It is also located within walking and cycling distance of the facilities and services in Checkley, providing residents of the site a real alternative to the use of the private car.

6.0 Objectives, Targets & Benefits

Objectives

- 6.1 The TP is a permanent document and ongoing strategy for enabling and encouraging travel by environmentally sustainable modes of transport.
- 6.2 The objectives of the TP are:
- to increase walking;
 - to increase cycling;
 - to increase the use of public transport;
 - to limit travel to the development by car to a level that can be accommodated by the proposed parking facilities;
 - where it is necessary to use the car, to encourage its more efficient use.

Targets

- 6.3 Targets will be set to assess the success of the scheme. The Targets need to be realistic, considering the existing situation and information gathered through the visitor and visitor travel surveys. The exact targets and a timescale for their achievement would result from the initial stage of the final Travel Plan once implemented.
- 6.4 Targets in line with general recommendations will be ‘SMART’ – i.e., Specific, Measurable, Achievable, Realistic and Timely. Examples of defined targets may include:
- Vehicle Trip Reduction
 - Single occupancy vehicle trip reduction/increase in multi-occupancy vehicle trips
 - Reduction in CO₂
 - Increase in walking and cycling
 - Increase in rail and bus use
 - Use of cycles, motorcycles, or greener vehicles.
- 6.5 The Travel Plan will detail the timescale by which the targets are to be achieved. This information will be provided (in the form of the final Travel Plan) once the initial travel surveys have been carried out.
- 6.6 On site promotion of the plan will be by the means of travel information and Travel Plan initiatives being displayed or made available within the communal entrances of the site.
- 6.7 This information will include details of public transport services, cycle, and pedestrian facilities.

Benefits

6.8 The introduction of a TP for the proposed development will:

- strengthen environmental performance and improve the environmental image of the site;
- make the local road network less congested and more easily accessible, improving relations with the local community and enabling vehicles to move more freely;
- offer wider travel choices to residents and visitors;
- help residents and visitors to be healthier and fitter;
- achieve Carbon Reductions and enhance environmental credentials;

7.0 Travel Plan Co-ordinator & Management Support

- 7.1 A Travel Plan Co-ordinator (TPC) will be nominated e.g. The Stilwell Partnership or similar. A named TPC is required. If the management agent is taking on this responsibility this must be written into the scope and an interim TPC from the developer provided. A TPC will be appointed 3 months prior to occupation and SCC will be advised who this will be (in the case of an interim TPC). The TPC is responsible for the whole development. The responsibilities of the TP Co-ordinator and the developer for the specific measures that are proposed are set out in **Section 9.0** (Committed Measures). The TP Co-ordinator will also be responsible to regularly liaise with SCC and occupants.
- 7.2 It is important to inform residents of the existence and benefits of the TP. It will be necessary to display relevant information in prominent locations where it can be easily viewed, such as, on notice boards and websites.
- 7.3 This aim will be to help build a sense of 'joint ownership' of the development. It is essential to listen to people's views about the TP and its initiatives. It will be necessary to collect feedback which will be achieved as part of the formal monitoring process as detailed later.

Co-ordinating and Communicating the Plan

- 7.4 To ensure that the TP is monitored and that effective communications are maintained with residents and visitors. The developer should aim to:
 - Appoint a Travel Plan Coordinator to be responsible for co-ordinating and progressing the individual elements of the TP and be available to liaise with the holiday makers.
 - Ensure the Travel Plan Coordinator determines and maintains such records as are necessary to monitor the effect of the TP and to adjust it, as necessary, to achieve the objectives.
- 7.5 The TP Framework set out here should be developed into a document that can be used to effectively communicate the aims and objectives to the residents and visitors and set targets, upon which the success of the Travel Plan can be measured.

8.0 Promotion of Sustainable Transport

Public Transport Information

- 8.1 Timetables, maps, and other information on the Bus and Rail Services will be included in new welcome packs, displayed at the entrances to the buildings and given on websites (where applicable).
- 8.2 There is also a wealth of information available over the internet. www.nationalrail.co.uk and www.trainline.com provide information public train services. www.staffordshire.gov.uk and staffsmoorlands.gov.uk provide information on all modes of public transport services.
- 8.3 Access to this information will be made available wherever possible, particularly over local community websites.

Walking

- 8.4 Walking will be encouraged as much as possible. This encouragement can be linked to health campaigns. The proposed development will widen the footway on the southern side of the A522 Uttoxeter Road to 2m wide. This will improve pedestrian linkages to the bus stop on the southern side of the A522 Uttoxeter Road and also provide a larger waiting area for pedestrians at the bus stop.
- 8.5 A footway is provided on the northern side of the A522 Uttoxeter Road which provides a continuous link to the bus stop to the east of the site and the village of Checkley to the west of the site.

Cycling

- 8.6 The development will have cycle parking facilities at the site in line with local standards. Cycling will be encouraged as much as possible and can be linked to health campaigns. All cycle route information available will be displayed for residents and visitors to observe at the entrance to the buildings on notice boards or similar.

9.0 Committed Measures, Funding and Dates

- 9.1 The developer will aim to undertake and fund the following measures as detailed in **Table 9.1** below.

10.0 Monitoring & Reviewing

Monitoring

- 10.1 Monitoring progress towards targets of non-car travel will be an essential part of the TP. The TP Coordinator will be responsible for recording progress. Residents will be surveyed as to their means of travel as part of the continuing target and to identify areas that can be improved.
- 10.2 A stamped addressed envelope will be provided to encourage a high response rate. A minimum response rate of 70% will be achieved. If questionnaires are not returned, face to face surveys will be conducted to ensure a minimum 70% response rate.
- 10.3 It will be necessary to agree with SCC a simple questionnaire / survey sheet, which can be used to record travel modes and numbers. Each employee will be expected to fill out this questionnaire. This should include at least:
 - Travel mode of residents;
 - Demand for car parking;
 - What problems do you have with public transport;
 - What incentives would encourage you to travel in a more sustainable way;
 - Where do you park (if driver).

- 10.4 An annual / bi-annual report with findings from the above surveys will be copied to SCC. This report will also make proposals for future measures towards achieving the targets as set out within the TP.

TP Review

- 10.5 It will be necessary to review the TP on a regular basis. The first review will be 6 months after first occupation and the second will be 18 months after first occupation. Subsequent reviews will then be undertaken in years 3 and 5, unless otherwise agreed with SCC.
- 10.6 Results from the travel surveys and monitoring process will be used in the TP Review in order that the strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and threats can be identified.
- 10.7 SCC will be shown copies of the review results and actions for the following TP so that an updated TP can be agreed.
- 10.8 The targets, set out in the final Travel Plan, will be referred to at every stage of the review process, to ensure that the original objectives of this Travel Plan are met. If the targets are not being met, then the TP Coordinator will investigate the reasons why the residents are not taking up some of the proposed measures and look at new ways of encouraging their take up.

11.0 Summary

11.1 This report sets out a Travel Plan Framework for the site. The main objectives of the TPF are to:

- Provide information on and promote the use of public transport;
- Encourage the use of public transport travel by residents;
- Reduce car usage;
- Promote walking;
- Promote cycling;
- A Travel Plan pack will be provided to residents of the development.


