Location Assessments address two issues:

- 1. Safeguarding Concerns
- 2. Accessibility of local services

The children's homes regulations 2001 as amended introduced a requirement in January 2014 for providers or managers to;

Ensure that the premises used for the purposes of a children's home are appropriately and suitably located so that children care for by the home are effectively safeguarded and able to access services to meet the needs identified in their care or placement plans; review the appropriateness and suitability of the location of the premises at least once in every calendar year.

This location assessment assesses the Alton area of Staffordshire to establish, as far as reasonably practicable, that Croft House is used for the purposes of a registered three bedded children's home and is in an appropriate and safe and suitable location.

This assessment will assist in evidencing that arrangements and strategies are in place to safeguard young people and identify services in the area to assist the team in supporting and meeting individual needs of young people.

Publicly Available Local Data

<u>CEOP (Child Exploitation Online Protection)</u> Ceop.police.uk

This is a command of the national crime agency and provides information on internet safety, missing persons, child protection networks such as thinkuknow.co.uk and internet guides- webcam.

75% of the most wanted sex offenders have been found through Crimestoppers.

CEOP's Thinkuknow programme provides educational resources. It helps to empower and protect young people from harm of sexual abuse and exploitation both online and off.

CATCH 22 offer a service for return to home interviews for the young people who are independent to the police and social services. CATCH 22 offer alternate services for CSE related issues and work with the young people and staff to reduce risks.

SSCB (Staffordshire Safeguarding Children's Board)

Chelsea's Choice is a resource/theatre play and session that highlights the seriousness of child exploitation. This raises awareness for all young people and the play can be targeted to young people, parents, carers, teachers, professionals working with children and the police.

The SSCB website provides information on how we can all work together to promote and safeguard the welfare and protection of all young people. It includes useful information such as how to make a child protection referral and updates on policies and procedures, E-Safety awareness and training resources.

There is Youth box information for young people which is a website that offers advice on how to deal with problems and issues an individual may be experiencing.

CAF (Common Assessment Framework) is an assessment capturing the Childs needs. It ensures all services work in a coordinated way. CAF is used when there is a concern of health, development, welfare and behaviour.

In the last 4 years the SSCB has completed 3 serious case reviews which is now published and it aims to embed good practice and improve front line practice.

Consultation with Appropriate Local Services

The homes local PCSO/ SPOC is

Area Care Homes Managers meetings are held quarterly with the local Police and the area's local authority.

The home will notify the areas local authority of any young person's admission to the home who are from out of area. In addition, as Croft House is a new children's home the local authority will be notified of the address, premises and purpose of business.

The home follows and completes the CSE Risk Factor Matrix for all young people admitted to the home.

RISKY AREAS & HOT-SPOTS:

HANLEY PARK:

- -The toilets on Regent Road has a lot of sexual activity.
- -The wall by the bowling green has a total blind-spot and a couple of sexual assaults have taken place here.
- -There is a group of Eastern European males who are known to target young girls.

LONGTON:

-People are meeting at McDonald's & Pizza Hut, going on the train- tracks for sexual activity, then freshening up in Tesco toilets.

Known risky areas will be shared at the forums to enable us as professionals to risk assess accordingly and match any young

person in placement.

RISKY PEOPLE:

-held confidentially but staff are aware of known names and will report to the police should there be a concern.

The Manager will attend Northern Providers Multi-Agency forums which focusses on current events such as "PREVENT" which is Extremism, Radicalisation & Terrorism highlighting signs to look out for and who to contact should you suspect someone is possibly being targeted and drawn into such groups.

Completion of Risk Assessment

Sources of information for the risk assessment have included the Local Police, Sergeants, PCSO, SPOC, Other Children's Homes Managers and the Local Authority.

Internet.

Development of Risk Management Strategies

Services such as the Youth Services and 'Safety Net' are working with the young people in the area carrying out direct work such as personal safety and other safety schemes and workshops.

The Police are working with the parents of the young people affected by CSE to serve abduction orders.

The local Police continue to patrol the area and address issues of substance misuse, anti-social behaviour & CSE.

The homes PCSO and SPOC will liaise with the home on a regular basis to reduce and minimise risks of all individuals.

The homes Manager and/or Deputy Manager will attend the area meetings with the Police to keep up to date with hazards in the local area and how we as a service can keep risks to a minimum.

Gather relevant information from the individuals placing authority such as LAC documents, Risk Assessments, Chronologies, Health and Education Records.

Missing Person Polices to be gathered from each young person's local authority.

Update Ofsted with Notifications including young people's admissions/discharges

Update the local authority of out of county young people and location of the new home Croft House.

Staff training to include: Safeguarding, Fire Safety, First Aid, Basic Food Hygiene, Behaviour Management, Attachment and Trauma.

Staff team meetings and supervisions.

Staff to encourage and support the young people to engage in Education, Further Education and Independence.

Staff to support the young people to live a healthy lifestyle by ensuring a balanced diet, medical appointments is met including individual health support such as CAMHS.

The home has a weekly therapist who deals with Cognitive Behavioural Therapy and addresses emotions, attachments, abuse and anxiety.

Educational Facilities on offer such as school, college, work placements, functional skills, Princes Trust, outdoor activity-based learning.

Young people will be encouraged to pursue hobbies and interests.

The above identified risks of the local area will deem difficult to RESTRICT but we as a service can LIMIT access through planning and risk assessment.
