Hello planning,

I'm not sure what the purpose of this modelling is. If it is intended to challenge the EA's flood zone mapping of the Kingsley Brook, then it will need to be submitted to the EA for assessment by them, (even if it is not a Main River). Has it been sent to the EA?

If it is intended to show that no part of the proposed development (as shown in the RSK drawing Engineering Appraisal Phase 2 in the FRA) is in the floodplain, then it doesn't appear to do that either.

The analysis then states that landscaping works will take the proposed Phase 2 out of the floodplain, but only by worsening flooding elsewhere. This includes the field opposite. Has this been agreed with the owner of that field please?

This analysis does not really address all the comments I put in reply to the last consultation, which I include again above. So I would have to continue to recommend refusal.

Thank you for consulting us on this planning application, our response is as follows:

Advice to LPA

We recommend refusal on the following grounds. If you are minded to approve the application contrary to this advice, we request that you contact us again to allow further discussion.

Staffordshire County Council Flood Risk Management position

In the absence of an acceptable Flood Risk Assessment (FRA)/Drainage Strategy we recommend refusal to the grant of planning permission for the following reasons:

Reason

The submitted documents do not provide a suitable basis for assessment to be made of the flood risks arising from the proposed development.

In particular, the submitted documents are not acceptable because:

- 1. Buildings are shown within Flood Zones 2 and 3 of the Kingsley Brook, including a foul pumping station.
- 2. A foul sewer for the western part of the site is shown discharging into manhole 1109 on Ayr Road. I believe this is a surface water drain that leads straight to the Cecilly Brook.
- You do not appear to have addressed predicted surface water flooding problems at the west end of the site, backing onto properties on Ness Grove or for the North part of the site around the playground at the end of Donkey Lane.
- 4. You have not established you have an agreed point of discharge for the surface water from the west part of the site, which is the Full application element.
- You have not explained how you will be achieving an acceptable rate of discharge of surface water from the west part of the site in comparison to the existing site.
- 6. You have not established where/how attenuated water will be accommodated within the site for the full application area.
- 7. I'm not sure how the building footprint corresponds to the included phasing plan.
- 8. Who will maintain the proposed surface water system over the lifetime of the development please?
- 9. I am not sure how the proposed sustainable drainage system is achieving any water quality improvements at all, which is a central design goal of these systems.
- 10. Development levels will need to be controlled where they abut to existing development in order to prevent surface water shedding into

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adjacent properties. Or else there should be perimeter land drains to intercept this flow.
