Recommendation and Conditions

The Environmental Health Department have no objections to this application but would advise the following conditions be placed on any permission granted.

<u>Noise</u>

1. Construction & Demolition works: Time of operations

Unless prior permission has been obtained in writing from the Local Planning Authority, all noisy activities shall be restricted to the following times of operations.

- 08:00 18:00 hours (Monday to Friday);
- 08:00 13:00 hours (Saturday)
- No working is permitted on Sundays or Bank Holidays.

In this instance a noisy activity is defined as any activity (for instance, but not restricted to,

building construction/demolition operations, refurbishing and landscaping) which generates noise that is audible at the site boundary.

Reason: To avoid the risk of disturbance to neighbouring dwellings from noise during unsocial hours.

2. Amplified Music

No amplified sound/ and or music shall be audible within or at the boundary of any premises either attached to or in the vicinity of the premises to which this application refers.

Reason: To ensure that the reasonable residential amenities of adjoining properties are adequately protected from noise pollution.
